

This Indenture made this twenty first day of May in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty one between William Arnold and Lucy his wife of the County of Grant & State of Kentucky of the one part; and William Layton, Samuel Simpson, Nathaniel Henderson, John Gipps, William Woodward, Price B. Hume ^{Arnold} ^{To} ^{Deed} ^{Grant City Court.} Gentlemen Justices of the peace in office for the County of Grant & State aforesaid of the other part Witneseth:

That the said William Arnold and Lucy his wife for and in consideration of the sum of one Dollar to them in hand paid at or before the sealing and Delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have granted bargained sold aliened conveyed and confirmed, and by these presents do grant, bargain sell alien convey & confirm unto the said William Layton, Samuel Simpson, Nathaniel Henderson, John Gipps, William Woodward, Price B. Hume, William Mountjoy, Hugh Withers & Charles Daniel Gentlemen Justices as aforesaid (for the use purpose & benefit of said County of Grant) and their successors in office for said County, three several Lots or parcels of Land situate in the County of Grant in Williams Town, on the Dry ridge road and which said several Lots or parcels of Land hereby conveyed are known and described in the plan or platt of said Town now of record in the Clerks office of said Grant County Court as follows to wit: The Lot or Piece of Land laid off and known in said Platt or plan as the Public square containing one hundred and fifty six poles, and Lots Number Twenty four and twenty five containing one fawth of an acre; Together with all and singular the appurtenances and emblements therunto appertaining belonging or in anyways appertaining. To have and to hold the aforesaid Lots or parcels of Land for the purposes aforesaid with the appurtenances unto the said William Layton, Samuel Simpson, Nath. Henderson, John Gipps, William Woodward, Price B. Hume, William Mountjoy, Hugh Withers & Charles Daniel Gentlemen Justices not for said County, their successors in office to signs to & for their only use & benefit as aforesaid forever. And the said William Arnold & Lucy his wife the aforesaid described and designated Lots or parcels of Land and Premises with the appurtenances unto the said William Layton, Samuel
